Feel free to donate a bag of dog food for 3 hours of credit. They use Hill Science Diet food. It can be purchased from the Tractor Supply Company. Treat boxes/bags will equal one half hour each. They can be turned in to Mrs. Studdard or donated directly to the Humane Society. Please take a service learning form with you as you train or volunteer. The staff there will be happy to sign the forms.

*MERIT League of Good Neighbors ... MERIT students may volunteer to clean/ mow the lawn or complete outside chores of a person who may find it difficult to complete chores on their own. Hopefully, MERIT students can identify needs within their own neighborhoods. They are encouraged to wear their MERIT team t-shirts while working! *Treehouse ... The Giving Tree Project . The holiday season can be a tough time both emotionally and financially for many families including the families we serve. Some children will even have to spend the holidays away from their home or in foster care. For those children who may frequently have to move from place to place, a colorful duffle bag monogrammed just for them can make these times a little less heartbreaking. This project allows volunteers from the community to "adopt" a child's Wish List so the child will have gifts to open during Christmas. Not only does this help the child feel loved and cared for during the holiday season, it also contributes greatly to their overall journey to healing. (1 Family = 6 hours)
