- You are studying how some Spanish verbs are called stem-changers because when they are conjugated, the stem changes in a predictable way. In one group of stem-changing verbs, the letter **e** in the stem changes to **ie** in all but the nosotros and vosotros forms. This particular type of stem-changing verb is found in all three verb types.
