

Your challenge:

Read 8 books this summer

The books can be fiction chapter books or nonfiction books.

Books should be appropriately challenging for you. (In other words, don't pick a book you read in third grade.)

Make an attempt to find books in your Lexile range!

Your book selections should not be 100% fiction or 100% nonfiction. For example, you could read 5 nonfiction books and 3 fiction books or 7 fiction books and 1 nonfiction book.

Your nonfiction selections could be biographies.

What you must turn in:

The title and author of each book

The type of book (fiction or nonfiction)

Where you found each book (for example: at home, TCMS eBook, the public library, a bookstore)

A 6-8 sentence paragraph that summarizes each book and explains your feelings towards the book

An example:

Title and author: Counting by 7's by Holly Goldberg Sloan

Type: Fiction

Where I found the book: the public library

Paragraph: The book *Counting by 7's* is about a girl named Willow Chance who has to find a new family after her adopted parents die in a car crash. Willow is not your average girl. She is different and strange, so fitting in is always hard for her. Even though things are tough for Willow, she learns that family is important and all families are not the same. I liked this book because it is funny and sad all at the same time. My favorite character was Willow's guidance counselor named Dell. The things they discover at his house really made me laugh!
